Dear students, postgraduate students and young researchers!

The Russian University of Traditional Arts (formerly known as the High School of Folk Arts - Academy) is the only university in Russia and the world that specializes in training professionals in 23 types of traditional arts and crafts from various regions of the country.

Our university's mission is to train artists in traditional arts and crafts directly in the regional-historical centers of this art—villages, towns and small cities—and to engage local youth as a guarantee for the revival, prosperity, and relevance of traditional arts and crafts in modern society.

The international mission of the Russian University of Traditional Arts is to promote interest and ethical attitudes towards countries and their national cultures not only in Russia but also within the international community through the high aesthetic quality of artistic works in each type of traditional arts and crafts.

The Russian University of Traditional Arts brings together top pedagogical, scientific and artistic talent to preserve, develop and promote traditional arts and crafts. Every year, it hosts a large-scale International Forum for students, postgraduates and young scholars titled "Russia's Culture in the 21st Century: Past in the Present, Present in the Future."

The forum serves as *the country's sole specialized platform for discussions, exchange of best practices and establishment of professional contacts among young people* who are bearers and advocates of traditional arts and crafts.

The goal of the Forum is to unite young opinion leaders who support the ideas and share the values of traditional arts and crafts, serving as a hub for youth initiatives and projects aimed at achieving long-term socially significant impact—the development of traditional arts and crafts as an integral part of national culture.

We propose initiating a broad *interdisciplinary dialogue* among young people about the paths of development for traditional arts and crafts. This dialogue will help us understand which regionally-historically rooted artistic and technological traditions are immutable and need preservation, and where innovations might be possible and acceptable. It will also explore how youth initiatives, scientific research and artistic developments contribute to the promotion of traditional arts and crafts, fostering interest and ethical engagement with the national cultures of Russia and friendly nations.

We also invite postgraduate students and young researchers to discuss ways and specific mechanisms to improve the system of continuous professional education in traditional arts and crafts. We encourage them to reflect on what competencies future artists will need in their professional activities. For students who have chosen the profession of a traditional applied artist, we suggest considering their own educational trajectories that can lead to successful self-realization, demand, social mobility and the desire to engage in traditional arts and crafts.

Appendix 2. Requirements for formatting theses of reports submitted to the Forum

Structure of the abstracts:

Title of the Report (in capital letters)
Author(s)' Last Name and Initials
Name of the University, Department
Abstract - brief summary of the report content (3-5 lines)
Keywords (minimum 3, maximum 7)
Main Text
References

Structure of the Main Text:

Introduction: In the introduction, you must establish the objective and goals of the research. Justify the relevance of the selected topic.

Main Body: The main body can be divided into several sections based on key themes (for example, analogues of the development, proposed solution).

Conclusion: Describe the outcomes of the work, highlighting the scientific novelty and/or practical significance.

The reference list includes bibliographic descriptions of the sources used, arranged alphabetically.

Text Formatting and Layout:

PAGE LAYOUT:

Text: Submitted as a * .docx file prepared in MS Word.

Language: Russian or English.

Volume: Recommended length is between 3 to 5 pages.

Paper size - A4 (210 x 297 mm), orientation - portrait.

Page margins: Top, right, bottom - 2 cm, left - 3 cm.

Headers and footers: Header height - 0.5 cm, footer height - 2 cm.

FORMATTING OF DIFFERENT TEXT ELEMENTS:

Tables. Tables should be numbered consecutively, with the table title appearing above the table itself. After the text "Table No." followed by a period, the table header should appear. The table header (top section) should contain titles for all columns. If tables are taken from external sources, references with bibliographical descriptions of these sources must be included.

Figures: Captions under the figure are mandatory, positioned centrally beneath the image. Figure numbers should be consecutive. Following the text "Fig. No.", the figure title should appear.

Figures should be placed in separate paragraphs, with text wrapping set to "above and below." In the paragraph settings, select "Keep with next" to prevent separation from the subsequent text.

The reference list should be organized alphabetically and include the following information: author's last name and initials, title of the work, journal or anthology title (if not a monograph), city and full publisher name (for monographs), publication year, volume, issue number and page range.

In-text citations are enclosed in square brackets, specifying the source number from the reference list along with the page number if applicable, e.g., [5, p. 45], [6; 7].

The material submitted for publication **must be original** and **not previously published in other printed or electronic publications.**

All materials submitted for publication are analyzed using a text-checking system to detect the use of borrowed material without proper citation of the author and/or the source of borrowing.

Materials submitted after the deadlines specified in the information letter, failing to meet formatting requirements, deviating from the forum theme, or containing plagiarism will be rejected and not published.

An example of how to format abstracts and a list of references:

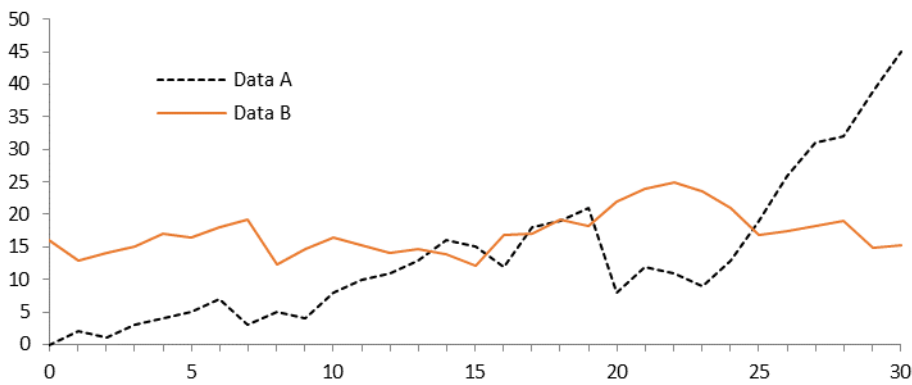


Fig. 1. Designation and title of the figure are placed below the figure itself. Short titles are centered, while longer ones are justified..

For citing or referencing, it is recommended to use the source number from the list of references in square brackets. In the provided example of the reference list, there are journal articles [1], conference proceedings papers [2], books [3], and internet resources [4].
